Their visits are not just for Derek—they come with open hearts, embracing everyone with kindness and care. Their emotional support, laughter, and shared moments help foster a sense of family among all who live and work there.

We acknowledge that when families enter a group living environment, they do so with vulnerability. They are trusting not just a service, but the people who care for their loved ones. In this particular home, the relationship between staff and Derek's family has grown into one of mutual trust, openness, and respect. The comfort and ease with which they interact is something to be proud of.

Shane and Joanne exemplify what it means to be community-minded and generous. Over time, they recognized the wear and tear in the well-used kitchen of their son's home and understood that government funding, while essential, does not always cover every need. Motivated not by recognition, but by a genuine desire to help, they offered to contribute financially to renovate the kitchen. What began with new cupboards expanded to include a much-needed bathroom vanity as well.
